

NORTH DAKOTA TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits survey conducted Sep. 9 through Sep. 10, 2022 by RMG Research Group. 500 likely Midterm Voters in ND participated in the survey.

81% of North Dakotan voters heavily favor an amendment to the North Dakota Constitution that limits the terms of state lawmakers and the governor to 8-years.

Also, a large majority (88%) of the voters favor an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that will place term limits on U.S. Senators and U.S. House Representatives. Voters also say that they would be more likely to vote for someone who signed the U.S. Term Limits pledge and that they're more likely to support state lawmakers who help advance congressional term limits.

Q1: An amendment to the North Dakota Constitution has been proposed that would place eight-year term limits on the North Dakota State Legislature and Governor. Do you favor or oppose passage of this amendment to the North Dakota Constitution?

Methodology

The survey of 500 Likely Midterm Voters was conducted for USTL on Sep. 9-10, 2022. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race. Likely voters were determined by a screening process within the survey.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.5 percentage points.
