



INDIANA STATEWIDE CONGRESSIONAL TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Indiana Survey of 505 Voters Conducted January 2-6, 2025

An overwhelming 84% of Indiana voters approve of placing term limits on members of Congress. The intensity of this support is measured in their willingness to vote for state legislators who will vote “yes” on term limits and against those who will vote “no” against term limits on members of Congress.

Conclusion: An overwhelming 84% of Indiana voters approve of placing term limits on members of Congress. The intensity of this support is measured in their willingness to vote for state legislators who will vote “yes” on term limits and against those who will vote “no” against term limits on members of Congress.

Methodology: The survey of 505 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on January 2-6, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the state’s population of registered voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.4 percentage points.
